Advent Hope

Today is the First Sunday in Advent, and since the 9th century, the First Sunday of Advent has been designated as the first day of the liturgical year. Happy Birthday Mother Church!

Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the King. One way to better prepare yourself is through prayer. We all know some prayers. We may even have a little booklet with all our favorite prayers in it. We may pray the Rosary every day, or have a favorite litany or novena. There are many ways to pray, and the new series for the bulletin this year is Prayer as Taught by the Master, Jesus Christ.

The Apostles looked to Jesus, their Rabbi (teacher) regarding prayer. Remember? *He was praying in a certain place, and when he ceased, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray."* (Luke 11: 1)

We all know that Jesus responded by teaching the disciples the Lord's Prayer. According to Peter Kreeft, the foremost living apologist in the Church today:

"Christ gave us not just one but four answers to the request "Teach us to pray."

First, He gave us "the Lord's Prayer", the prayer that contains all prayers because it contains everything we ought to pray for, everything we ought to love, everything we ought to hope for.

Second, He gave us His example. What prayers did He and His disciples pray? The Psalms! As all Jews have done ever since they had them. The Psalms are GOD's answer to the request "Teach us to pray."

Third, He gave us the Mass, the perfect Prayer, in which we offer not just our prayers but our Divine Pray-er Himself.

Fourth, He gave us His mother, from the Cross.

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), Part Four, Christian Prayer, are found some of the most beautiful words ever spoken and written on prayer. For example, "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy." These words were written by the Little Flower, Saint Thérèse of Lisieux. An from Saint John Damascene, "Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God."

You may ask: "Where does prayer come from? Whether prayer is expressed in words or gestures, it is the whole man who prays. But in naming the source of prayer, Scripture speaks of the soul or the spirit, but most often of the heart (more than a thousand times). According to Scripture, it is the heart that prays. If our heart is far from God, the words of prayer are in vain. The heart is the dwelling-place where I am, where I live; according to the Semitic or Biblical expression, the heart is the place "to which I withdraw." The heart is our hidden center, beyond the grasp of our reason and of others; only the Spirit of God can fathom the human heart and know it fully...it is the place of covenant." (CCC ¶12562-63)



We know all of that to be true because the Scriptures tell us 'more than a thousand times.' Here is something even better, what Jesus tells us about His Heart.

"Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Matthew 11: 28-30)

This statement made by Jesus teaches us something particular about Jesus and prayer. He leads by example. We know how busy His life was, and He knew what it was to have life's burdens, yet He always took the time to go off, by Himself to pray. He tells us to do what He did, we are expected to learn from Him. We might not be able to go off by ourselves for any great length of time, but if we start with a short period of time, even if it is 5 minutes, the time will grow as you find the spiritual rest He promised us.

The words of the great Saint Teresa of Jesus (of Avila) helps a lot of busy people. She speaks of mental prayer, but the quote works for all prayer. She wrote "For mental pray, in my opinion is nothing else than an intimate sharing between friends; it means taking time frequently to be alone with Him who we know loves us."

Amen.
