

This was part of a sermon, "Infidelity of the Future" that Saint John Henry Newman preached to seminary students in 1873 about the challenges they would be facing in their future. It was an indication of things to come. He said:

"I know that all times are perilous, and that in every time serious and anxious minds, alive to the honor of God and the needs of man, are apt to consider no times so perilous as their own...still I think that the trials which lay before us are such as would appall and make dizzy even such courageous hearts as St. Athanasius, St. Gregory I, or St. Gregory VII. And they would confess that dark

Forty Hours Adoration

Starting on Friday, November 11th, our parish will be celebrating 50 Hours of Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in honor of the 50th Anniversary of the Diocese of Charlotte. This 50-Hours of Adoration is based upon the traditional 40-Hours Adoration that the Church has practiced for several centuries. Saint John Neumann brought the practice to the United States in the mid 1800s when he was bishop of Philadelphia.

In 1844, Catholics were facing hostile opposition in the city of Philadelphia. During the Know-Nothing Riots, anti-Catholic protesters burned two Catholic churches just to make their point. Many of the local priests were hesitant of having 40-Hours Exposition because they feared desecration of the Blessed Sacrament by people expressing their anti-Catholic sentiment. The Lord spoke to Bishop Neumann and told him not to be afraid. Neumann had the 40-Hours Adoration, and the practice spread.

Forty is an important number in the history of our Church. For example, back in the time of Noah, it rained forty days and forty nights. The Jews wandered in the desert for forty years with Moses. Jesus fasted and prayed in the desert for forty days and nights before He began His public life. And finally, remember the forty-hour period, over three days, that Our Lord spent in the tomb after His crucifixion until His Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Pilgrim Image of Mary to Visit Immaculate Conception



At 2:00pm, on Thursday, November 10th, the Pilgrim Image of Mary will arrive at Immaculate Conception Parish. This is only one of more than one-hundred stops on Mary's pilgrimage through our Diocese, celebrating 50 Years of the Church's service to the people of God. Our Lady's image will be making a spiritual pilgrimage to visit the faithful across our diocese just as she did in her "Visitation" to St. Elizabeth. Through participation in this memorable Marian Pilgrimage, our diocesan family comes together by uniting parishes, missions, schools and other Catholic institutions in prayer to God through the intercession of our patroness.

The Diocesan website explains what a pilgrimage is all about.

"A pilgrimage is no ordinary journey. It's a kind of "holy traveling" undertaken with resolve for a particular spiritual purpose. Throughout Church history the faithful have traveled to holy sites – whether it's a place where a saint lived, a miracle occurred, or a saint is especially honored – to obtain a special favor and do penance for one's sins.

How can you have a fruitful pilgrimage? Simply carry a special prayer intention in your mind and heart! You can have a single intention, or a different one for each destination. Upon arrival kneel near the altar or statue of Our Lady and pray fervently, asking her to intercede with Jesus for your request. Conclude by offering prayers of gratitude and thanksgiving. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!"

This last paragraph is the key to getting and giving the most during this Pilgrim Image of Mary visit to our parish.

Early on, in planning for this visit, Father Burke suggested that since we had the opportunity to do so, we could experience Mary's Pilgrimage to Forest City along with the special 50-Hours Adoration. It makes for a very busy few days, but it provides an opportunity to gather many spiritual graces for our parish.

What can you do during a visit for veneration of the Pilgrim Image of Mary? Sit for a while. Pray a decade of the Rosary. Say your favorite Marian prayers.

If your visit to the Mother coincides with an adoration visit to the Son, pray a full 5decade Rosary. There are several booklets in the Narthex devoted to our Lord and our Lady that might give you some ideas of other prayers to say. More importantly, sit, talk, and perhaps...listen to two very Dear Friends.
